




# Latvian Children's Games

# Weaving Words – A Tapestry of Languages, Interactive Storytelling and Poetry Performance

This interactive performance brings together students and participants to celebrate linguistic richness through storytelling and poetry in multiple languages.

Under the coordination of Elena-Arleziana Radoi (Romania) and Ovidiu Baloşin, the activity invites people from diverse cultural backgrounds to share short poetic lines, proverbs, or brief narratives in their native language, woven together into a multilingual "tapestry" of voices.

The activity will also include improvised translation moments, brief explanations of cultural references, and interactive dialogue with the audience. Poetry will be both performed and visually represented on a board or textile roll, creating a symbolic 'woven text'.

Participants can also contribute words or short verses on colored ribbons, which will be attached to a large frame, symbolising unity in diversity.

# Voices Unplugged: Bringing Villach to the World

Inspired by CUAS's contribution to Science Slam Villach (2023), this project brings together a vibrant mosaic of voices from around the world in an extended, creative format.

Students from CUAS of diverse cultural backgrounds - including Kazakh by Alina Pak, Vietnamese from Hilde Schweiger, Bantu from Devin Majilana, Kurdish from Diana Ashrapfour, Persian from Ali Shirledian, Austrian German from Isabella Ofenbauer and Maya Leitner, Albanian from Sara Shala, Ukrainian from Mariia (Marsel) Osovska, Italian, and American English from Sonia Moncaleano - share their heritage not through scientific talks, but through personal expression, humour, and performance.

This exhibit showcases non-scientific, freestyle contributions ranging from stand-up comedy and storytelling to music and singing, all performed in participants' native or cultural languages. Each performance offers a playful, heartfelt, or thought-provoking insight into the speaker's identity, community, and worldview.

"Voices Unplugged" is more than entertainment—it's a space where culture meets creativity, and where linguistic and artistic diversity are celebrated through the universal power of the spoken (and sung) word. Visitors are invited to experience the rhythm, humour, and emotion of global cultures as told by those who live them.

# Presentation of the Traditional Kashubian Women's Folk Costume

During the presentation of the costumes we would like to discuss the meaning and nature of used colours, e.g.:

- · Green: Kashubian forests
- · Blue: the sky over Kashubia
- Navy blue: the depths of the sea where Kashubians fish

#### and the meaning of Kashubian embroidery, e.g.:

• Flowers such as tulips or palmettes are embroidered.

There are over 10 schools of embroidery such as Puck, Bytów and Gdańsk. And the meaning of headgear such as wreath = maiden, cap = married.







### Living & Static Exhibition of Romanian Traditional Costumes

10:00-16:00 | Location: Hall A

This activity brings the vibrant spirit of Romania to life through a living and static exhibition of traditional Romanian costumes.

The exhibition will be available throughout the entire festival, giving participants the opportunity to admire authentic folk attire from different regions of Romania and to take photos with the displayed costumes. On a designated day, for one hour, a special presentation will be held. During this live session, each costume will be introduced and explained in detail — highlighting the symbolism, function, and regional uniqueness of each element. Alexandru Popescu will moderate the session.

To enrich the experience, a background video will showcase beautiful Romanian landscapes, traditional villages, and festive events. At the same time, Magda, a member of the team, will demonstrate traditional Romanian hair braiding for female participants from the audience who wish to take part. Hair braiding is an age-old custom symbolising femininity, beauty, and celebration in Romanian culture.

This activity will create a joyful, immersive atmosphere that blends cultural education with interactive engagement.

This exhibition of posters featuring 14 languages of Europe, Asia and Africa (Albanian, Bantu, Bulgarian, Filipino, German/Austrian, Kazakh, Kurdish, Latvian, Romanian, Russian, Russian Sign, South African, Ukrainian, Vietnamese) made by the students of Intercultural Management (ICM) programme at Carinthia University of Applied Sciences (CUAS).

ICM is a bachelor programme at CUAS aimed at fostering future leaders of culturally diverse teams, that come from all corners of the world and are ready to shine! The posters made for German and Italian language classes in their 2nd semester of studies demonstrate a both linguistic and cultural comparison of national contexts from different countries or even continents: Ukrainian and Latvian, Kazakh and South African, Filipino and Kurdish, Bulgarian and Russian, Albanian + Romanian, German and Austrian and many more!

# From Austria with... Confusion? Visual Novel Game

A visual novel, created by a 3rd semester Intercultural Managment student of CUAS, Shurä Boyarshinova, set in snowy Carinthia in 1999, where city-spirits - humanoid embodiments of Austrian cities - gather for their secret annual Christmas party.

When a snowstorm traps them in a remote hotel, old grudges resurface. Tensions rise as you uncover buried histories, explore questions of identity and conformity, and share meals rich in Austrian tradition.

City-spirits, usually hidden from the human world, now face each other with centuries of unresolved conflict. As the millennium approaches, it's up to you to help mend broken bonds, navigate cultural pride, and find warmth in food, memory, and unexpected connection.









# Static digital poster "Mapping Austria"

This design created by 2nd semester student of Intercultural Management, Rhys Butler, explores the rich diversity of people living in Austria - both those who were born here and those who have made it their new home.

Through stylised character design, it highlights the wide range of cultures, backgrounds, and identities that shape everyday life in Austria. Special attention is given to internationals - students, workers, artists, and families - who bring their own stories and perspectives, contributing to the evolving character of the country.

At its heart, the piece is about unity: despite our differences, we share common ground. Whether it's a love for schnitzel, appreciation for the alpine landscapes, or the sense of community found in everyday moments, there are countless ways we connect. This project is a celebration of those connections and a hopeful vision of how, by recognising both our uniqueness and our shared experiences, we can come together to build a better, more inclusive future - together.

The myth of Don Juan has become one of the great archetypes of European literature.

Each version reflects the spirit of its time and the characters of the culture that adopts it, transforming the seducer into a mirror of the society that recreates him. This exhibition invites you to explore his different faces and discover how a character born in Spain became a universal myth.
